On your behalf, VP Roy and I attended the Annual State Congress in Newcastle. As reported in the last *Dispatches*, the new Board of Directors were confirmed and assumed their roles at the rising of Congress. This was a matter of discussion at our November Monthly General.

Thank you to Leigh Haines for the following article: WHAT'S IN A NAME

Most of the streets in the RSL LifeCare ANZAC Village have names, commonly names of theatres of past conflicts in which Australian armed forces were involved, famous military personnel or commanders of Allied forces. The two streets in the Labuan II Precinct which run parallel to Lantana Avenue did not have names, which led to difficulties for delivery drivers and to residents' visitors.

This was raised with the Residents' Representative Committee and was put forward to the ANZAC Village management to name the streets after senior commanders of the Battle for Labuan Island.

In June 1945 the Battle of Labuan was an engagement fought between Allied and Imperial Japanese forces on the Labuan Island off Borneo. Following several weeks of air attacks and a short naval bombardment, soldiers of the 24th Brigade Australian Army's I Corps, were landed on Labuan. The Australians quickly captured the island's harbour and main airfield.

After securing the island, the Allied forces developed Labuan into a significant base and in late June 1945 the island's airfield was repaired and expanded to host Royal Australian Air Force units.

During the period of the conflict on Labuan Island, there were two Australian Army commanders of the Allied forces:

Lieutenant General **Sir Leslie James Morshead**, KCB, KBE, CMG, DSO, ED was an Australian soldier whose military career spanned both world wars. In May 1944 he was given command of I Corps, leading them through the final battles of the war in Borneo. which included the battle for Labuan Island.

Major General **Sir George Frederick Wootten**, KBE, CB, DSO & Bar, ED was a senior Australian Army officer who earned the respect of his soldiers and superiors. In 1945, he commanded the 9th Division in the Borneo campaign, including the amphibious landings at Brunei and Labuan.

RSL LifeCare ANZAC Village management were supportive of the suggestion that the two unnamed roads in the Labuan Precinct be named **Morshead** and **Wootten** after the two Australian Army commanders of the Allied forces involved in the Battle of Labuan Island.
